
The latest news and updates from Superior Elementary School




PARENT PICK-UP & DROP-OFF PROCEDURES:

Parents should drop-off their child by either 1) driving to the front of the west drop-off lane in front of the elementary building main doors and letting their child out of the vehicle, 2) driving to the front of the drop off lane on the north side of the building and letting their child out of the vehicle, or 3) parking in the parking lot on the north side of the building and walking their child to the front doors. Students may also walk to school using the new sidewalk on 8th street. Parents picking-up their child should park in the parking lot on the north side of the elementary building or on Paw Print Road on the south side of the building. Crossing guards will be at both locations to help students enter/ exit the school grounds safely.
